Rain didn't dampen the resolve, enthusiasm or turnout at our annual Kayak Regatta on Saturday, August 20. More than 50 non-motorized vessels (kayaks, canoes, paddle boards) headed up the Niantic River behind the Goshen Fire boat in the pouring rain to the live music by Denise and Tony Band! The parade ended at Point Comfort in front of the last mile of unprotected, undeveloped Oswegatchie Hills. More supporters joined on the shoreline at 47 Oswegatchie Road. Participants ducked under tents and umbrellas to enjoy the hot clam chowder and hot dogs donated by Flanders Fish and The Dock. More participants came at noon when the showers ended. It warmed Board Members hearts to see how many people came out to enjoy the river & support STR-STH despite the weather!!

Save Oswegatchie Hills Coalition – Update

Our traveling display is on the move, building public awareness and support for our collective cause to get the remaining 236 acres of Oswegatchie Hills protected and in the adjoining Oswegatchie Hills Nature Preserve (OHNP.) Perhaps you saw fellow STR-STH and Friends of OHNP volunteers at these events around the region over the past few months:

- © Waterford Public Library display of Wildlife and Water through September, thanks to Fred Grimsey for helping to set it up!
- © Waterford Community Center, we filled the corridors with our maps and photos of the Niantic River watershed and illustrated how the illconceived proposed development on the northern one-third of the Oswegatchie Hills threatens the remaining coastal forest, including the last mile of undeveloped, unprotected coastal shoreline of the Niantic River, and the tidal estuary that flows directly into Long Island Sound. At the WCC opening reception on September 21, First Selectman Dan Steward welcomed guests to WCC and encouraged them to learn more about the significance of Niantic River and neighboring Oswegatchie Hills in East Lyme to Waterford community, residents and businesses.
- Our tents at Celebrate East Lyme Day and Old Lyme Midsummer Festival attracted lots of attention and questions from people, many who live in the Niantic River watershed, have hiked OHNP trails and/or get out on the water.

The Coalition also was featured in CFE's and Save the Sound's Summer 2016 newsletter, *SoundBites* and *GreenSheet*, with photos of Fred Grimsey and Mark Spery with Rob Klee, Connecticut's Commissioner of Energy and Environment at the June unveiling at East Lyme Community Center.
