## This year a special Native American Blessing of the Niantic River and the Oswegatchie Hills by Jay Levy at 11:30am

Jay works for The Mohegan Tribal Historic Preservation Office and Archaeology Department. He also sits on many Native American advisory boards as a Cultural Advisor, integrating Indigenous ideology, tribal tradition, and cultural protocol into land preservation. In 2012, he helped coordinate an intertribal Mishoon (Canoe) journey from the Shinnecock reservation in New York to the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Indian territories along the Thames River in Connecticut. In 2015, his family assisted in the project "Reclaiming the Waterways: Mission Mishoon—The Dugout Canoe of the Pequots". They used a traditional method of burning and hand scraping to construct the largest dugout canoe made in over 200 years and paddled it in the Mystic River. Jay also works for the Appalachian Mountain Club Southern New England Trails Office monitoring water sources at campsites.

## President's Message:

STR-STH is pleased to announce that we have been awarded two grants written by our board member Suzanne Thompson (see page 3). Suzanne will be working with the high school teachers, students and others to complete the grants and will handle grant administration.

The DEEP has replaced our thirteen year old Pumpout boat with a 2 year old modern craft. The original Pumpout boat will be turned over to STR-STH to use as the water quality monitoring skiff. This is a DEEP vote of appreciation for our Pumpout Program.

We have also started the second year of the Unified Water Study with Save the Sound and Dr. Jamie Vaudrey of UConn will continue on as the lead for the program. We are very excited to be part of this bigger look at the quality of water in the LI Sound! Our information will be gathered and added to the other areas being monitored to help governments and organizations make informed decisions about things that impact the LI Sound.

Our organization has come a long way and with your continued support we will be able to work even harder to Save the River and the Hills.

### Legal Defense Fund — Help Us Save Oswegatchie Hills!

We continue our legal battles with the developer. The Judge has called meetings and conference calls with the lawyers for the Town of EL, the developer and our Save Oswegatchie Hills Coalition lawyers for multiple discussions about appeals of both Sewer and Zoning decisions. We continue to be hopeful that the Judges will weigh the environmental issues on this case as much as the other considerations. Please remember we are still engaged in the battle to Save the Hills when you renew your membership!

## **Pumpout Boat Program**

We started our 15th season of the Pumpout Program Memorial Day Weekend. Spread the word—the Niantic River and the entire Long Island Sound is a No-Discharge Zone by order of the U.S. EPA. #### STR-STH Lands Two Watershed Outreach Grants!

We have received two grants to engage the energies of high school students in public outreach campaigns to reduce nitrogen and pollution runoff in the Niantic River Watershed and Long Island Sound.

© Community Foundation of Eastern Connecticut awarded us \$10,000 to carry out our Behavior Change campaign (see our March -April 2018 newsletter) with students at the 3 public high schools (Montville, East Lyme & Waterford) that serve the 4 towns in the Niantic River Watershed. We are one of 22 organizations that received funding in 2018 from CFECT's Environmental Grants, totaling \$677,500.

We launched the program with a June 2 cruise on Project Oceanology's "floating classroom". Students from all 3 high schools were on board to learn about water quality and its effects on the creatures of the LI Sound during the cruise from Groton to Niantic Bay. Once there, they met our Pumpout Boat crew and conducted water quality tests of Niantic River and Bay waters.

In September, Waterford High School will host a workshop on Niantic River Watershed pollution and prevention efforts. Students will prepare and conduct public education and outreach campaigns in their respective communities, encouraging residents to reduce their pollution runoff into the region's tributaries.

© Rivers Alliance of Connecticut selected our "Get Pumped" Campaign proposal to receive \$2195 from its Watershed Assistance Small Grants Program. In this campaign, East Lyme High School students will encourage East Lyme residents on septic systems to keep their systems maintained, inspected and pumped out on a regular basis. They'll also help promote STR-STH's Pumpout Boat and encourage anyone with pets to keep the poo out of our waters.

The Niantic River Watershed Committee is a partner with us on both of these public outreach programs. The next time you run into Suzanne Thompson, congratulate her for creating these Watershed Education opportunities and for landing the grants to fund the work!!
