A Note from the President and Founder of STR-STH:

- Landmark's 4th Appeal has been remanded (sent back) to the E. Lyme Zoning Board by the judge. He instructed the Town to make extensive changes to the way they deal with affordable housing applications (not just Oswegatchie Hills). This could be a major blow to our efforts to save the Hills. Please stay tuned, or better yet, follow the zoning commissions work on this matter by calling the town hall.
- 2. We are working on the Pumpout Boat to get ready for the 2012 season. We got approval from the DEEP which covers 75% of the cost. We are awaiting to hear from the towns for the remaining 25%.
- 3. We are starting work on repairs on the Water Quality skiff. We will meet soon with the Dept of Public Health on expanding data gathering on non-point source pollution of the River. We are advocating that the towns of E.L. and Waterford institute septic tank pumping regulations which we feel is the major source of pollution coming from the watershed.
- 4. I have been attending meetings of the Niantic River Nitrogen Workgroup. Anyone interested in this, please contact me.
- 5. We are still in need of a new Board Member to fill the position of legislative liaison. This person would keep us informed of federal and state programs that can help or fund our efforts. If you want to nominate/suggest someone, please do so by calling Fred at 860-287-2654 (cell).

Also, if you would like to help getting our boats back in the water (after the ice clears!), please give me a call. I can definitely use the help this year!

Water Quality Action Alert!!—Jordan Brook

A Kobyluck gravel mine has been proposed to be near enough to Jordan Brook that a Waterford Environmental Hearing has been held and will be continued. Jordan Brook runs through where they want to mine. The Brook is home to native trout habitat that will be affected by the blasting, crushing and the toxic (to the fish) runoff are 'byproducts' of the operation. Educate yourself on this issue and join us in going to the meetings to show your support for the preservation of an important waterway that flows directly into the Long Island Sound.

STR-STH Program Updates...

Legal Defense Fund – Help Us Save Oswegatchie Hills!

The Judge has decided that the 3rd Appeal (for approximately 850 units) can stand and remanded the developer's proposal back to the Zoning Board with orders to incorporate the developer's proposed zoning changes. We are uncertain as to what that means, but we know it was not good news. We will keep you up-to-date as the Town of EL lets us know any more details.

Watershed Education Program

Our Education Program is once again working with East Lyme High School's AP Environmental class to clean

up Latimer's Brook (the headwaters of the Niantic River) where it runs behind Tri-town Plaza. The Enviroscape (shown right) is being borrowed by the Children's Museum for this month. We are also teaching the children at the Children's Tree Montessori School with our Enviroscape this Spring. If you would like to be involved in an education project or have an idea of a school that might want to use it, please call Deb at 860-444-9247.

Water Quality Testing Program

We finished bacteria testing last fall working with Ledge Light Health District. The Study Report of our data on bacteria in the Niantic River after a rain event "in excess of 2 inches of rainfall" is now in the hands of the DEEP and Niantic River Watershed Action Commission (NRWAC). When Fred discussed the very high readings with the DEEP, he was told that we would need a daily monitoring process to have "anything done". Our research has un-

veiled that each town, under "Town Rule", has the authority over use of a waterway within its jurisdiction. We will continue to monitor the River and let the town's of Waterford and East Lyme know of our findings.

There is also ongoing work being done by the Nitrogen workgroup of NRWAC.
